GET TO KNOW TRIUMPH SERVICES

- Triumph, a nonprofit 501(C)3 organization, provides community-based support to individuals with developmental disabilities who are trying to live independently. We strive to help participants grow in independence, assume greater personal responsibility, and increase community involvement.
- Triumph works with individuals who have a variety of disabilities. Some
 individuals may struggle with a learning disability; others may have a
 rare genetic condition that affects their cognitive abilities. Though
 demographics may differ, the challenges tend to be the same- the need
 for independence, for a meaningful job, and for friends.
- Services are centered on three aspects of existence-living, working, and playing. Triumph offers life coaching (live), supported employment (work), and social activity coordination (play).
- Historically an underserved group, adults with developmental disabilities typically do not qualify for funding from the Department of Mental Health or the Medicaid Waiver. In fact, 40,000 individuals who are struggling with autism in the state of Alabama, 60 percent of them do not qualify for state funded mental health services.
- Triumph relies on tax-deductible donations to fund its scholarship program for participants who need financial assistance.
